IMPORTANT DATES THIS TERM

MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

1 January

Feast of Mary, the Mother of God begins a new year. This is an occasion to renew our devotion to Mary, who is also Mother of the Church because she is our spiritual mother.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

7 January

The Church has a custom of blessing homes on the Solemnity of the Epiphany (January 7th this year, although usually January 6th) and the weeks following. Family and friends gather to ask God's blessing on their homes and those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

8 January

This feast brings to an end the season of Christmas. The Baptism of the Lord Jesus Christ at the Jordan symbolically marks the beginning of His ministry.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

2 February

This commemorates the presentation of Jesus in the Temple forty days after his birth, by Mary and Joseph.



ASH WEDNESDAY

14 February

This is the beginning of our Lenten season of growth and change. We receive ashes on this day as we are reminded to turn away from wrong choices. The ashes come from the burned palms from last year's Palm Sunday celebrations.

ST JOSEPH, SPOUSE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

19 March

We honour Joseph and remember the importance of his faith.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

24 March

We remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem where he was met by crowds of people waving palm leaves and shouting "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

MAUNDY THURSDAY

28 March

We remember the Last Supper of Jesus Christ. Jesus sits down with his friends and washes the disciples' feet. Today is the beginning of the Easter Triduum.

GOOD FRIDAY

29 March

A solemn and sacred day in the liturgical year marking the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ.

EASTER SUNDAY

31 March

Alleluia! We rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.
