Main school

9.00 am - 3.30 pm

Classroom doors are open from 8.45 am and we start promptly at 9.00 am.

School runs a successful Breakfast Club each day 8.00am – 9.00am catering for up to 30 children from Y1-Y6.

We also offer clubs both at lunch time and after school usually finishing at 4.30pm. After school clubs should be booked at the school office these are available for Y2 to Y6 in a wide range of activities catering for all interests.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding our pupils is our number one priority. All staff are trained in Safeguarding and our Headteacher and our Deputy Headteacher are our Designated Safeguarding Officers. As a school we work closely with Sunderland Council and Clennell Education Solutions Safeguarding teams.

We follow the guidance of 'Keeping Children Safe in Education'. We regulary update our safeguarding procedures ensuring our school is a safe and secure environment for all. All staff are DBS checked before they can work in school.

Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND)

St. Mary's School welcomes all children in the community. We ensure that all children have the same opportunity to fulfil their potential and to participate in all areas of school life including access to the National Curriculum.

St. Mary's endeavours to ensure that all children in the school are fully included in school life and recognises the importance of working in partnership with families and outside agencies where applicable. We have a SEND Co-ordintor in school who is the main point of contact for any queries.
